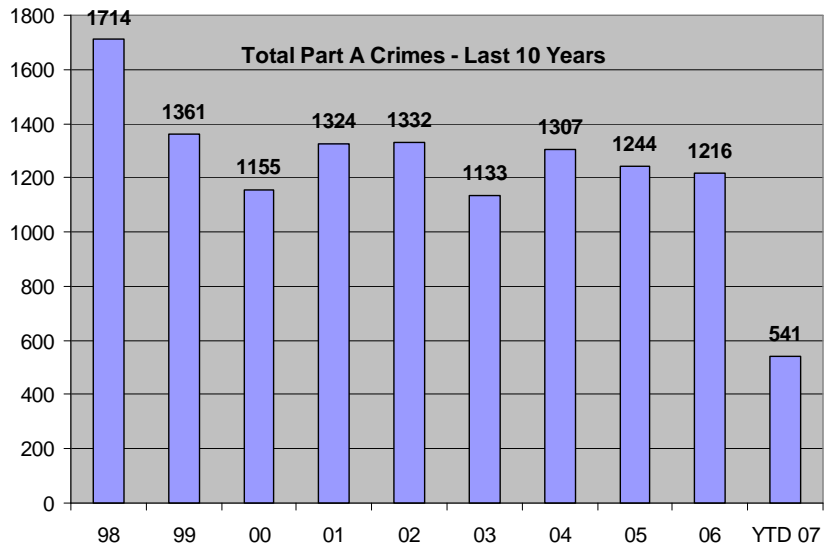


JANUARY THRU JUNE 2007 PART A CRIMES

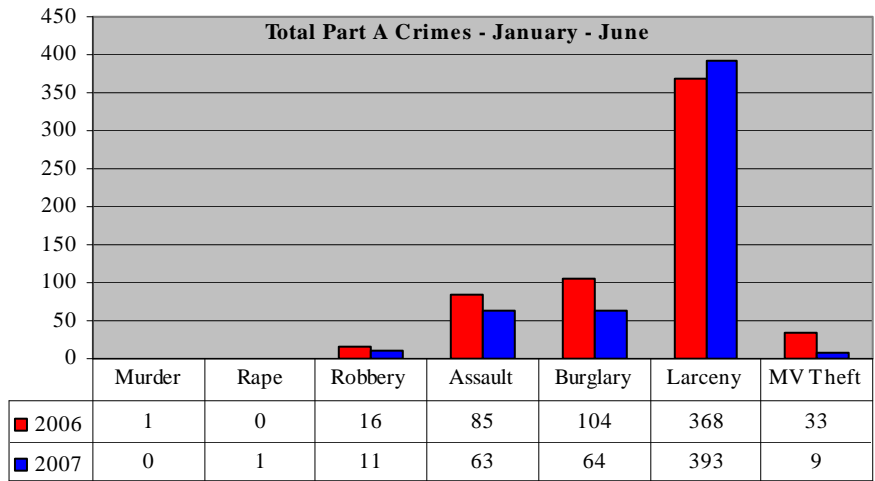
The following is a summary of Part A Crimes in Brookline during the first six months of 2007. Part A crimes include: murder, rape, robbery, assault, burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft.

In the first half of the year, there was a total of 541 Part A crimes reported in Brookline, down 11% from the 607 Part A crimes reported during the same period in 2006.

Crime in the first half of 2007 was down in five of the seven categories as compared to the same period in 2006, with increases in incidents of rape (increasing from none to 1) and larcenies (increasing from 368 to 393).



The following graph shows the year-to-year comparisons for each crime category. As displayed, crime is down in five of the seven categories for the first half of the year.



MURDER – DOWN 100%

There were no murders during the first half of 2007, down from the one murder that occurred during the same period of 2006. There was one subject charged with attempted murder following a domestic assault and battery arrest.

RAPE

During the first half of 2007, there was one rape reported which resulted in an arrest. This case involved a father molesting his 9-year-old daughter over a period of a couple of month. There were no rapes reported during this same period of 2006 and a total of 7 reported for all of 2006.

ROBBERY – DOWN 31%

There were 11 robberies during the first half of 2007, down 31% from the 16 robberies during the same period in 2006. Of these 11 robberies, 4 involved a firearm, 1 involved a knife and 6 were unarmed/strong-arm robberies. Five of these cases remain active and six resulted in arrests. These robberies occurred on the street (6), convenience stores (3) and restaurants (2). There were also four attempted robberies and 3 reported incidents that were found to be baseless reports.

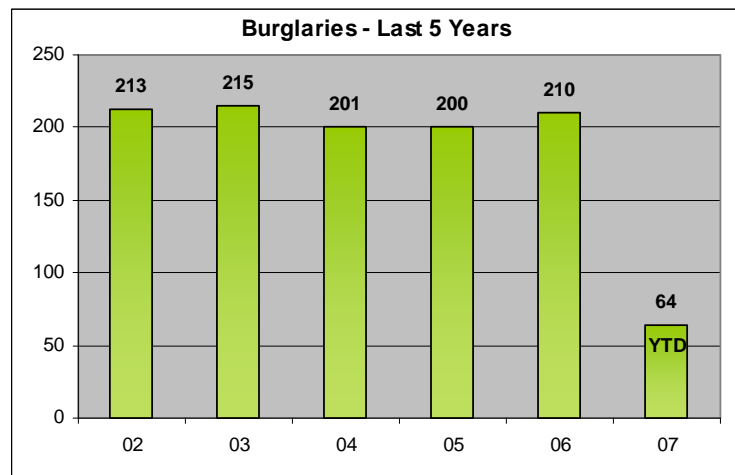
AGGRAVATED ASSAULTS – DOWN 26%

Aggravated assaults are down with 63 reported during the first six months of 2007, down 26% from the 85 reported during the same period in 2006. Of the 63 assaults reported between January and Jun, none involved the use of a firearm, 4 involved a knife or some other cutting instrument, 17 involved another type of dangerous weapon and 42 involved the use of hands, fists, or feet. Eight of these cases involved an assault on a police officer, 4 were a result of a road rage altercation, 6 were mutual assault and batteries, and 22 were domestic/family situations. 87% of these cases (55) were cleared by arrest or court action.

Additionally, during the first half of 2007, there were no sexual assaults and four indecent assault and batteries. Of the four indecent A & Bs, two were cleared exceptionally (Boston arrested the suspect for similar incidents in their jurisdiction), one led to an arrest and one was closed because the victim did not want to pursue the incident. Two of these incidents occurred on Winchester Street, one on Chatham Street and one at the Brookline High School. Indecent A & Bs, like sexual assaults, open and gross and indecent exposure incidents, are classified separately as sex crimes.

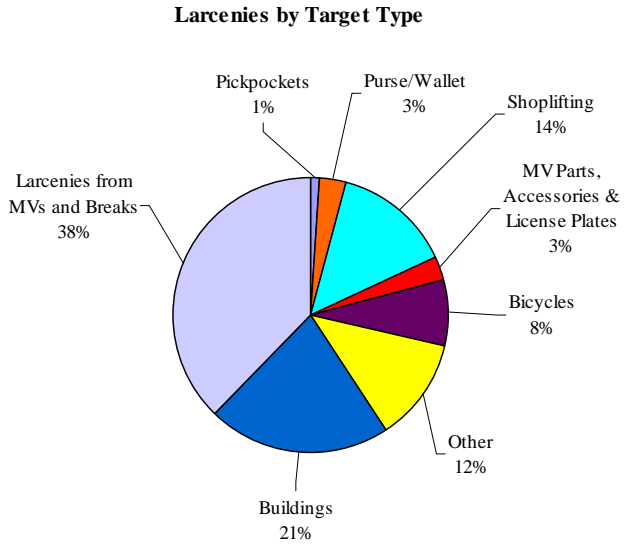
BURGLARY – DOWN 38%

Burglary is down 38% in the first half of 2007 with 64 incidents, versus the 104 burglaries reported during the same period in 2006. 47 burglaries (73%) were of residential properties and 17 (27%) were of nonresidential properties, including a school, a bank, offices, and commercial establishments. 25 cases remain active, 19 resulted in an arrest or court action and 8 were cleared exceptionally. There were 12 attempted burglaries during this time as well.



LARCENY – UP 7%

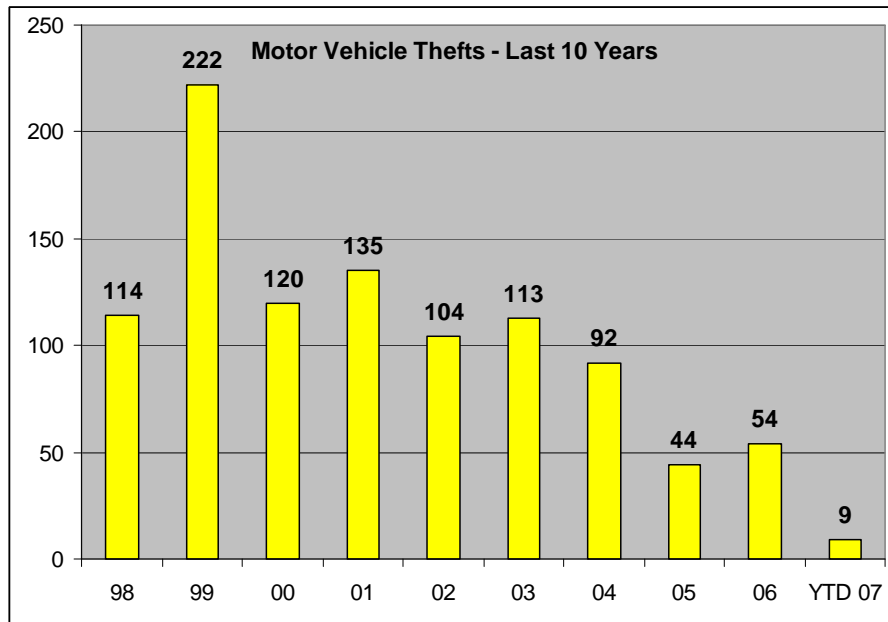
With 393 incidents during the first half of 2007, larcenies are up 7% from the 368 incidents during the same period last year. Of note is the volume of GPS thefts from motor vehicles, with 45 stolen this period (the target in 30% of all car breaks). Please see the chart for the breakdown of larcenies by target type.



MOTOR VEHICLE THEFTS – DOWN 73%

There were 9 motor vehicle thefts reported during the first half of 2007, down 73% from the 33 reported in the first half of 2006. In all of 2006, there were 54 motor vehicle thefts.

The most common motor vehicle makes stolen during the last six months were Toyota (3) and Lincoln (2). Additionally, there were one each of the following makes: Honda, Lexus, Mercedes, and Oldsmobile stolen. Of these 9 cases, 4 remain active and 5 were cleared due to the vehicle being recovered.



POLICE ACTIVITY FOR JANUARY THROUGH JUNE 2007

- **Clearances** – In the first half of 2007, there were 143 cases cleared, down 26% from the 194 cases cleared in the first half of 2006.

- **Arrests** – During the first six months of 2007, there were 353 arrests, down 24% from the 463 arrests during the same period last year. There were also 40 people taken into protective custody and 9 people registered as sex offenders during the first half of 2007.
- **Field Interviews** – Between January and June 2007, there were 700 field interviews conducted, up 31% from the 535 field interviews during the first half of 2006.
- **Moving Violations** – During the first half of 2007, there were 10,666 moving violations issued, up 16% from the 9,214 that were issued during the first half of 2006.
- **Parking Tickets** – During the first six months of 2007, there were 77,415 parking violations issued for a total of \$2.1 million in fines and penalties. This number is down slightly (less than 1%) from the 77,622 parking violations issued during the same period of last year, which generated \$2.2M.
